To keep children safe from bullying and respond to signs of targeted or bullying type behaviour.	Work with staff on how to deal with incidents of discrimination or pupils being bullied. Address bullying issues through lessons and curriculum events.	Pupil interviews highlight how pupils feel safe in school. Pupils know what to do and who to speak to if they feel at risk of bullying.	
Ensure all pupils have access to full range of curriculum clubs, trips and events.	Review curriculum events and activities to ensure all pupils are included regardless of need.	Pupils from all different backgrounds are fully represented in activities, clubs and events.	
To ensure all pupils in school are aware of, appreciate and value diversity.	Ensure all curriculum displays represent difference and a diversity of backgrounds.	Children express positive views about people who they see as different to themselves.
